Electric Utility Department Capital Projects:

13kV to 23kv Conversion – US17 from Harbor Road to CR 315

Planning for this project has begun. This project will continue the Chapman 1 and Chapman 2 circuits north of Harbor Road to provide capacity and reliability for existing and future customers north of Governors Creek. Materials for this project are being funded by a DEO Grant. Materials have arrived and are being installed. We have installed all materials except for one commercial customer that will require an outage, and we are working with the customers to obtain a time we can both agree on to do the swap over. This month we took down over 13,500 foot of overhead cable and have worked our way to the last customer so we can swap them over to the new voltage and then we will finish taking the wire down all the way to Harbor Rd.

Northend of town Conversion

The month of September we have had our contract tree trimmers clearing the path the new wire will be taking so we can set poles in the near future to pull new wire down CR 209 from Mahama Bluff Rd to where Governor's Creek crosses to CR209.

Rookery Subdivision

We have started working on Phase 2A which will be the main road going through the subdivision from 15A to US 17 and we are currently about 50% done with that phase. This phase consists of pulling in six sets of cables through the main road not only to supply power to the subdivision but also an express feeder out to US 17. This month we pulled in a total of over 22,000 feet of cable. We also worked with the private electricians on site to open transformers and secondary boxes so they could pull in the secondary cable to the new houses that had passed final inspection. We have been able to start pulling in cable on the side roads of phase 2 which includes pulling cable, setting transformers and pulling secondary cable to pedestal boxes.
